	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A commitment to a low-carbon future. • Actively support international negotiations towards an Environmental Goods Agreement at the WTO. • Consult on establishing an environmental tribunal. • Ban fracking. • Introduce a new Clean Air Act. • Set guiding targets for plastic bottle deposit schemes, working with food manufacturers and retailers to reduce waste. • Work with farmers and foresters to plant a million trees of native species. • Keep the country’s forests in public hands. • Establish a science innovation fund. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accepts the referendum result. • The Conservatives’ Great Repeal Bill will be replaced with an EU Rights and Protections Bill. • Make make sure that all EU-derived laws that are of benefit are fully protected without qualifications. • Scrap the Conservatives’ Brexit White Paper and replace it with fresh negotiating priorities that have a strong emphasis on retaining the benefits of the Single Market and the Customs Union. • Immediately guarantee existing rights for all EU nationals living in Britain and secure reciprocal rights for UK citizens who have chosen to make their lives in EU countries. • Reject ‘no deal’ as a viable option and if needs be negotiate transitional arrangements to avoid a cliff-edge’ for the economy. • Build a close co-operative future relationship with the EU, not as members but as partners. • Labour will review the UK’s historic investment treaties with other countries, ensuring they are fit for purpose for the 21st century.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pass five green laws: a Green Transport Act, a Zero-Carbon Britain Act, a Nature Act, a Green Buildings Act, and a Zero-Waste Act. • Oppose fracking. • Establish a Cabinet Committee on Sustainability and an Office for Environmental Responsibility. • Introduce an Air Quality Plan to reduce air pollution. • Establish a diesel scrappage scheme, and a ban on the sale of diesel cars in the UK by 2025. • Extending ultra-low-emission zones to 10 more towns and cities. • Reform vehicle taxation to encourage sales of electric and low emission vehicles and develop electric vehicle infrastructure including universal charging points • Set new legally binding targets to reduce net greenhouse gas emissions to zero by 2050. • Expand renewable energy. • Restore the zero-carbon standard for new homes. • Establish a £2 billion flood-prevention fund. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hold a referendum on the final Brexit deal, with the option to remain in the EU. • Fight against a hard Brexit to keep Britain as close as possible to Europe. • Unilaterally guarantee the rights of EU nationals in the UK whilst fighting for reciprocal rights for UK citizens living in European Union countries. • Remain in the single market and customs union. • Support freedom of movement between the UK and EU. • Fight to ensure that EU based entitlements such as maternity leave and annual leave are not undermined.
